Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Who am I? What is my purpose?

These are two universal questions asked by endless numbers of people throughout every generation. They are good questions and I commend all who search for meaning and purpose for their life. A life without purpose is meaningless and stagnant. They say that the happiest and most fulfilled people are those who love what they do, what they are good at, and sharing it with those around them gives them purpose.

But as Christians we know there is problem in every person which blinds them to determining meaning and purpose for life. And even when they can determine a purpose for their life, it will be self-serving. The problem is original sin, our old sinful nature. Before their fell in sin, Adam and Eve knew their identity and purpose because they were created in the image of God - perfect, holy, knowing God and finding fulfillment in accomplishing God's will. But all that changed with their fall into sin. Clarity about one's purpose and identity are now veiled in darkness.

Being spiritually blind to the truth of God and trapped in the grip of sin, even when man sets a purpose for living, there will be no true lasting happiness or fulfillment. Because of sin's corruption man has no moral compass, and will choose only to please himself, at the expense of others. True meaning and purpose for live is allusive, for man searches in all the wrong places.

But there is one place that reveals the answer to these questions. The only place with the answer is in the Bible. There is no specific verse which says, "The meaning of life is...," but the Bible reveals God's purpose for us, and it is in fulfilling that purpose we discover meaning and satisfaction in our lives.

When we are called to faith in Jesus Christ by the Holy Spirit through the Gospel, we become a new creation. We are "born again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you." I Peter 1:3,4. Our conversion through faith in Jesus Christ is the beginning of this new way of life. The new life we live seeks to serve God's will and purpose, and is a life culminating in eternal life in heaven. We are Disciples of Jesus Christ. And being a disciple defines who we are and our purpose. Who am I? I am a redeemed child God whose sins are forgive, an heir of His eternal kingdom. My purpose? To tell all people the Good News of God's love for them in Jesus Christ. To tell all people that God has a purpose and plan for their lives. Take a moment and ponder the following definitions.

#### **DISCIPLE**

A *Disciple* is a person who accepts and assists in spreading the teachings of another.

#### **CHRISTIAN DISCIPLE**

A *Christian Disciple* is a person who accepts and assists in the spreading of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

#### **DISCIPLESHIP**

*Christian Discipleship* is the process by which disciples grow in faith in the Lord Jesus Christ through study of God's Word, and are equipped by the Holy Spirit to become like Christ.

*Christian discipleship* is the process that progressively brings Christians from spiritual infancy to spiritual maturity, so that they are able to guide others in becoming faithful disciples of Jesus Christ.

As followers of Jesus Christ, we need to know what matters most to Him so it can matter most to us. Thankfully, Jesus reveals this to us in His written word. After His resurrection, and just before His ascension back into heaven, Jesus told His disciples what was uppermost on His mind. It is the Great Commission recorded, Matthew 28:19,20. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you." The mission of the church is to make disciples, followers of Jesus Christ, who believe in and assist in spreading the Gospel to make more disciples.

Who am I? I am a **disciple** of Jesus Christ. What is my purpose? To know and accomplish God's will for my life in the world. And what is true for us as individual Christians is also true for us as members of Good Shepherd Lutheran Church. We are here to share the Good News of Jesus Christ so that all people will know the plans that God has for their lives. "For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope." (Jeremiah 29:11).

Our goal is to gather all people around God's Word so that they can receive and find happiness in the plans that God has for their lives.
