LWML May Food Drive

We sponsored the food drive in celebration of the 80th year of LWML (Lutheran Women's Missionary League.) Thanks to everyone's generosity we received 87 food items. This was 7 more than our goal of 80 (to match the 80 years of LWML). Pastor David Hartgrove from Assembly of God picked up the food on June 1. He said they are having above normal requests from people needing help with food. He asked that we let everyone know how much they appreciate the donations as we work together to help those in need.

VBS 2022

River of Life VBS will begin July 24th (if we teach the first lesson during Sunday School) or July 25th and will have 5 lessons. The last lesson is the Baptism of Jesus and points us to our Baptism. The lessons will each feature water and a different country will be the Mission Focus.

The craft portion of VBS will echo some of the craft for the region we visit each day. For one of the crafts, I need small jars (baby food or the glass yogurt pots would work great). I will put a small box in the Narthex near the bulletin board to collect these.

Most of all please pray for our VBS, our teachers and assistants, and the students.
