The verses that launched Luther

Romans 1: 16-17 – For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith for faith, as it is written, "The righteous shall live by faith."

As we celebrate the 505th anniversary of Luther nailing the 95 theses to the door of the church in Wittenberg Germany, we remember this verse from Romans that completely change the way Luther saw scripture. You see Luther didn't always believe that the Grace of God, through faith, was enough to warrant salvation; Luther saw God as a just and righteous God and was terrified by God's righteousness because it meant that he would punish all those who fell short of it, including himself. He says:

"Nevertheless, in spite of the ardor of my heart I was hindered by the unique word in the first chapter (of Romans): 'the righteousness of God is revealed in it.' I hated the word 'righteousness of God,' because in accordance with the usage and custom of the doctors I had been taught to understand it philosophically as meaning, as they put it, the formal or active righteousness according to which God is righteous and punishes sinners and the unjust."

Luther felt trapped in his sin and hated the righteous God who punishes all sins, for he feared that nothing he could ever do would make him righteous before the eyes of the righteous God. But then, God opened his eyes to scripture, when he read Romans 1:17 in its original language of Greek and discover that, unlike in the Latin translation that he was familiar with, the phrase "righteousness of God" was passive, meaning something we recieve. He says:

"Then finally God had mercy on me, and I began to understand that the righteousness of God is a gift of God by which a righteous man lives, namely faith, and that sentence: The righteousness of God is revealed in the Gospel, is passive, indicating that the merciful God justifies us by faith, as it is written: 'The righteous shall live by faith.' Now I felt as though I had been reborn altogether and had entered Paradise. In the same moment the face of the whole of Scripture became apparent to me. My mind ran through the Scriptures, as far as I was able to recollect them, seeking analogies in other phrases, such as the work of God, by which He makes us strong, the wisdom of God, by which He makes us wise, the strength of God, the salvation of God, the glory of God. Just as intensely as I had now hated the expression 'the righteousness of God,' I now lovingly praised this most pleasant word. This passage from Paul became to me the very gate to Paradise."

Luther then understood that God makes us righteous, not by our deeds, or our ability to avoid sin, but by His own righteousness that He imparts to us, as a free gift of faith, through the righteousness of Christ Jesus. The rest, after that is, of course, history.
