Missouri Lutherans for Life

The annual meeting for *Missouri Lutherans for Life* was hosted at Trinity Lutheran in Columbia on Sunday May 6th. Two Good Shepherd members were in attendance. Pastor Joseph McCalley of Trinity led the opening devotion then his presentation, "How do we die well?" This presentation was accompanied with a nice handout booklet that features scriptural answers to many questions people may have about the dignity of the dying process, how the body we have will be united with our soul in glory. Outgoing *Missouri Lutherans for Life* President, Diane Albers, gave her report. Rev. Scott Licht, CFO/COO of *National Lutherans for Life* then gave a detailed presentation on "End of Life Consideration". His topics included the documents we need to have in place, palliative care, hospice, caring for caregivers, grief, suffering, cremation, organ/body donation, and decision making on removing life support. Lunch was served by the ladies of Trinity Lutheran.
