November 10, 2023 Water Leak

The morning of November 10th Alane Gronefeld discovered a very wet kitchen area from a leak in the mechanical closet upstairs. Brenda Moss was contacted and her husband Bob came up to shut the water off to prevent more water loss. Randy Simmons came up to start moving some of the water in the kitchen area while the insurance company and ServiceMaster were contacted to start water mitigation.













On November 17th, approval was received to do the demolition of damaged areas, which was minimal. The demolition began and was completed on November 18th. On November 19th the last piece of drying equipment was removed. The stoves in the kitchen were turned on and all burners and ovens worked. On the 19th it was determined the repair work in the kitchen would not interfere with Advent dinners or the turkey dinner on December 10th. The fellowship hall was also cleared for use. A claim has been filed with GuideOne, the deductible is \$2,500.



ANNOUNCEMENTS

President- The president has the duty to preside at all meetings of the Communicant Members.

<u>Recording Secretary</u> - The recording secretary shall record the minutes of all meetings of the Communicant Members and carry on all communications as directed by the Communicant Members.

<u>Financial Secretary</u> - The financial secretary shall be in charge of counting all moneys, received by the church, and shall be in charge of keeping records of all contributions by individual members, furnishing each member with an accurate annual report of their contributions. The financial secretary shall make all deposits of money in the bank, turn over deposit slips to the office secretary, and will be in charge of supplying envelope packets to each communicant. In the event of the absence of the financial secretary at service, Elders shall take charge of the money, but turn envelopes over to the financial secretary unopened. The financial secretary shall send a receipt and a note of thanks to non-member contributors.

<u>Board of Elders</u> - The Board of Elders shall aid the pastor in supervising the spiritual life of the congregation; make the necessary provisions for and render the necessary assistance to the pastor at devotional services; preserve decorum in devotional services; supervise ushers, organist, acolytes, and the Altar Guild. The Board of Elders shall direct and supervise all educational activities of the congregation and shall appoint the Superintendent of the Sunday School, and all non-professional teachers of the congregation. The Board of Elders will meet at least six times per year – in those months in which the Board of Christian Growth does not meet.

<u>Board of Trustees</u> -The Board of Trustees shall see that all necessary repairs on the church property are made, subject to the resolutions by the Communicant Members; hold in trust of the congregation all deeds, contracts, insurance policies, and other documents pertinent to the physical property of the congregation, and in general, represent the congregation in legal matters; be responsible for calling to the attention of the congregation such matters as may affect or are beneficial to the congregation as a property owner. They shall supervise the janitorial services.
