Thankfully, soon enough, it will be summer and Good Shepherd will host a special VBS time for our children and the children in our community. VBS is a special time for us to come together to share and learn about JESUS in a kid-friendly way. Directing VBS is most rewarding when planned well enough to have plenty of volunteers in place.

YOU—the members of GSLC-- are the volunteers. No matter your age—you are well designed by our LORD to help with VBS in some way. We have plenty of time for Ann to meet with you to explain the volunteer needs so you will know how to help us on these dates:

Sunday mornings Aug. 10 & 17 (Ann just needs a couple volunteers to assist her for these morning classes during Sunday School) Monday-Wednesday Aug. 11-13. Volunteers arrive around 5 pm and leave around 8:30 pm.

Need

CREW LEADERS – can be a teen or adult who will be responsible for the same five (5) children each evening. Lead them to each station. Follow the tips in the *Crew Leader Guide* to help the children listen and learn the bible message at each station.

STATION LEADERS – can be adult of any age who will use the *provided leader guide/materials* to present at your station up to four times each evening; repeating the same material every 20 minutes to each Crew who rotates through your station. Station leader areas are:

- *Bible Adventures* (present the day's bible story)
- Games
- *Imagination Station* (science experiment each day)
- *Sticky Scripture* (follow the directions in the guide to help kids learn the day's scripture verse)

PRESCHOOL STAFF – Work with children age 3-5 but not yet in Kindergarten-- will have their own special space and exploration stations after they begin the first 30 minutes with everyone else at the Opening called Sing and Play.

Other ways to use your God-given talents to help VBS----

- 1. Gather supplies
- 2. Pray
- 3. Provide food for a light meal each evening
- 4. Greet families at the Registration table
- 5. Decorate our VBS space

We have about **12 of our own GSLC kids**. Let's set a goal of gaining **12 more kids** to attend our VBS. If we have 20 elementary age kids come—then we can form four CREWS to rotate through our learning stations listed above. *Dear Lord*,

Thank you for this opportunity to share Jesus with our own children and share the gospel message with families in our surrounding communities. Give courage to our GSLC members that they may volunteer to help our VBS program be a success. Help Director Ann to plan well so that the Volunteers feel comfortable with their roles. Amen
