Closer Than a Brother

A man of many companions may come to ruin, but there is a friend who sticks closer than a brother. (Proverbs 18: 24).

Men and women are different; this simple fact should go without saying, but in our broken modern world, even something as obvious as this must, in fact, now be stated. Though we are the same in many respects, and are both equally made in the image of God, we are also purposefully designed to complement each other, and therefore designed differently by intention. Men and women experience life, and perceive the world, differently, and one of the ways that this takes shape most prominently is in our relationships with each other, especially with those who are of the same sex. It is no secret that when men and women gather together, they do so with different goals in mind, and tend to focus on different things. The relationship between women, tends to be a face-to-face type of relationship that is more subject-focused; in other words, women are more relational, and when they gather, they tend focus on people. Men, the other hand, tend to see their relationships with each other as a shoulder-to-shoulder relationship that is more object/objective focused; in other words, men are more recreational, and when gathering, focus on tasks or things. Neither way of looking at relationships are necessarily better or worse, just different; however, when it comes to dealing with life's struggles, especially in a modern world that is so virtual and detached, men seem to have a much more difficult time dealing with such things. Women are always reaching out to see how each other are doing, forming support groups and meeting together more often. Men, however, want a reason to meet, and are more likely to suffer alone rather than meeting for the sole purpose of talking about sharing their problems, often fearing that this is awkward and burdensome; and yet, men do need each other, just like women need each other.

As a man of the millennial generation, I recognize that my generation, and the men of the subsequent generation z, are having trouble in finding meaningful brotherly relationships. There are many factors contributing to this, but regardless of the reasons, these generations of men, more than the preceding generations, are more lost and aimless, and are desperately seeking purpose and community. In the past few decades, we have seen droves of men leave the Church for various reasons, but now we are starting to see them come back to the Church, or come to the Church for the first time, and what brings them to her doors is the hope of finding that purpose and community that they are hungry for.

For me, this need has inspired the impetus for the formation of a multigenerational men's group, where men from the younger generations can come along side older, life-wise men, to learn from each other and grow together. We kicked of this group the weekend of May 2-4 at Heit's Point with our first men's retreat; we had 8 men attend, including 5 from Good shepherd and 3 from Campus. It was a fun retreat where we got to study God's word together, bond over activities like disk-golf, and sit down to discuss what this men's group should look like. But this is only the first step; we hope that from this retreat we can cultivate interest and momentum, leading to a genuine brotherhood of godly men, ready and able to serve God and build each other up In keeping with our shared ministry commitment, and by clear consensus, this group will be a joint venture between the men of Campus Lutheran and Good Shepherd. Much like our shared ministry partnership between our two congregations, our initial focus will be to get to know each other through fellowship and gathering to study the Word. Eventually, we hope that this grows into a ministry where men can bring and share their life skills and talents, teaching and passing on what they know in various disciplines, to their brothers. Because men are task-oriented, and bond through activities and projects, we have discussed the possibility of building things together or finding things that we could re-build or fix; this would give men a task to work together on, and a chance to teach and learn from each other. This would all then move toward equipping each other for service projects and community outreach, where we as men of God can come together to serve our communities.

As men, we need each other, that brotherly bond that strengthens, and that fatherly bond hones and matures; Let us therefore come together as men, to love the Lord, and serve Him as men of God.
