VOTERS MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

Katie Hoek will step down as Sunday School Superintendent – Kim Rainey will be the new Superintendent and Donna Hoek will be the Assistant Superintendent. Rally Day will be September 7th.

The LWML Craft Fair will be November 1st.

It is recommended those interested in *Financial Peace University* join the next class that will be held at Campus. Pastor will reach out to the facilitator and advise the date.

The *Vision Team Members* for the *Ministry Clarity Project* are Mark & Rina Nygren, Danny Nadler, Jon and Donna Hoek, Wendy and Allen Fischer and Betsy Cochran. Watch for details about a *Congregational Event* to be held in October.

The *Budget Committee* will be Jeff Jaeger, a trustee-to be named, Randy Simmons, Jacki Stelzer and Catherine Simmons.

It was voted to have *Economy Tree of Centralia* remove the dead/dying trees on the church property. They started removing the trees July 30th.

The voting members decided to get bids to re-gravel the parking lot for the October meeting. All of the asphalt bids were rejected.

Information about a new pictorial *Church Directory* was presented by Donna Hoek – voters approved moving forward with scheduling. Donna will set this up.

Aaron Seider represented GSLC at the LCMS MO District convention and reported President Lee Hagan was unanimously reelected as MO District President. Aaron advised the President Hagan is also the Chairperson of the LCMS Council of Presidents. The Circuit Visitor is Rev. Anthony Alter. The convention is held every 3 years and there are four targets for this triennium: Church Worker Recruitment and Retention (please see the announcement about a special offering for this effort); Discipleship in the Home; Mission Field: Missouri; Leadership development of laity and church workers.

Aaron discussed several resolutions from the convention including *Recruit Youth and Adults to consider Church Work* with *Set Apart to Serve*; Circuit Visitors will have a forum to consider needs/recommendations for small congregations and further discuss *Shared Ministry in Small Congregations; Encourage Discipleship in the Home* with *Tell the Next Generation* coaches available at the district level. Aaron also reports there has been a realignment of circuits and Columbia circuit loses St. John's in Mexico; and *Opposing MO Amendment 3 – the Missouri District explicitly opposes Amendment 3; the District supports and encourages its members to engage in appropriate political action to abolish abortion; the District furthermore declares that teaching in the church that abortion is acceptable due to the non-personhood of the fetus is a false teaching that rejects a full understanding of Christ's incarnation, which no Christian in good conscience can hold.
