¹⁹ Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰ For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin. ²¹ But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²² the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³ for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴ and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵ whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶ It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus. ²⁷ Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸ For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

Black cross Symbolism: Faith in the crucified Christ.

Explanation: The cross, placed in the center of the heart, represents the suffering of Christ on the cross and the pain it caused. Despite this, the cross brings righteousness and life to those who have faith in the crucified Savior.

Red heart Symbolism: Faith and the life-giving love of God.

Explanation: The heart is red to symbolize the life-giving love of God in Christ. For Luther, the heart also remains in its "natural color," signifying that faith does not destroy our human nature but keeps us alive through belief in the crucified one.

White rose Symbolism: Joy, comfort, and peace that faith brings.

Explanation: The heart is placed in the center of a white rose to show that faith provides joy, comfort, and peace. The rose is white, not red, because white represents the color of spirits and angels, symbolizing a heavenly joy that is not of this world.

Sky-blue field Symbolism: Heavenly joy and hope.

Explanation: The rose sits on a sky-blue field, symbolizing that the spiritual joy of faith is the beginning of the future heavenly joy that is to come. This joy, while not yet fully realized, is grasped through hope.

Gold ring Symbolism: Eternal bliss and salvation in heaven.

Explanation: The golden ring that encircles the entire symbol signifies that the bliss and joy of heaven are endless and more precious than any other treasure, just as gold is the most valuable and precious metal.
